KWVA Sports is responsible for the once a week sports talk show Quack Smack, daily sports reports, and live broadcast of University of Oregon Women's Volleyball, Soccer, Lacrosse and Softball.

How to get involved in KWVA Sports:

1. Fill out and return application.
2. Potential sports volunteers will receive email or phone call within a week to further discuss application and available opportunities. Training is based on the potential sports volunteer's interest. No experience is necessary, but a knowledge of sports helps. Possible areas of volunteering include: reporting, on-air talent, script writing, board operation and production. The potential volunteer will be provided with a manual of information about the station and sports volunteer duties.
3. All sports volunteers begin with a basic station operations introduction and training, which includes shadowing, hands-on training, policy review.
4. Once a sports volunteer has become oriented with the station, he/she sits as a board operator for one term (3 months) and does reports, production and script writing.
5. Once a sports volunteer has done board operation, reporting, production and script writing, he/she may be eligible for on-air talent opportunities, including calling games and hosting live talk programs.
6. A sports volunteer participating as talent is required to aid in script writing, packages, board operation and/or production.
